### This Week/Term

A big welcome to our new children in Nursery and welcome back to our previous pupils. The children have settled in really well and have been busy making friends and getting to know our daily routine.

**English:** We are starting a new topic called 'Marvellous Me' which the children will learn more about their bodies, exercise and healthy eating. We will be reading lots of lovely nursery rhymes in class and as part of our phonic sessions we will be encouraging the children to make as many voice sounds as they can, for example what animal noises do the animals make in Old McDonald? Ask your child what nursery rhyme they have read each day and see if they can teach it to you.



**Maths:** We will be doing a daily number hunt where the children will find a hidden number in the classroom, we will then focus on that number during the day and get lots practice writing the number. It would be brilliant if you could play games with your child out of school and see what numbers they can spot in the environment.



**Continuous provision:** As part of our play based learning we have set up a healthy smoothie bar. The children have loved making different recipes using lots of fruits and vegetables and this week we will be making and sampling our very own smoothies!
