As a parent/guardian I/we will therefore try to:-

- have trust and confidence in the professionalism of staff in their ability to do their job. Ensure differences or disagreements with staff are not discussed with or in front of your child
- support the Catholic ethos and values of our school ensure that my child has sufficient sleep so he/she comes to school ready to learn
- support the school's high standard of behaviour by encouraging my child to follow the school Code of Conduct
- accept that my child may sometimes make the wrong choices and allow him/her to accept the consequences and to grow from the experience
- ensure my child is in school every day, unless he/she is ill.
- ensure holidays or days away with, for example sports or dance clubs/troops are arranged for school holiday periods
- minimize disruption to my child's education by arranging medical /dental appointments outside of school time, unless in an emergency
- take an active interest in my child's homework, including reading, by providing a suitable environment, support and encouragement
- attend parents' meetings and discussions about the progress of my child
- inform the school of any concerns or problems that might affect my child's work or behaviour
- provide up to date emergency contact details so school can get in touch if my child is taken ill or has an accident, informing school immediately of any changes to contact details
- ensure that my child is collected from school on time by a responsible adult until he/she is old enough to make his./her own way home, informing the school of any changes to these arrangements
- ensure that my child comes to school wearing **FULL** school uniform, including regulation school shoes,. equipped with a **complete** P.E. kit and when requested, swimming kit. This includes a warm coat as the weather gets colder (hooded tops are not acceptable)
- ensure children's medical needs are met i.e. inhalers, glasses, epi-pens etc. are provided and maintained and inform school if medical needs change
- ensure my child's hairstyle is in line with school policy i.e. non shaven, dyed, or extreme

- set, mark and monitor homework suitable to your child's needs

- send home a written annual report of your child's progress or in exceptional circumstances e.g. illness/incapacity of class teacher, provide a one to one verbal report on your child's progress from a suitably qualified member of staff
- provide you with regular information about your child's progress at termly parent-teacher meetings and provide you with opportunities to talk to teachers about any concerns
- keep you well informed about school policies and activities through regular newsletters, website and texts to your mobile.
- support parents in developing their understanding of their child's learning journey
